
Allow me just a moment to scream into the ether.







Cinnamon Sugar Cupcakes

I'm aware cinnamon is more of an autumnal spice stereotypically, but who says you can't have it in February to warm you up? These little cupcakes were a hit with my friends when I made them, so I think you'll enjoy them too!



#### **INGREDIENTS:**

200g self-raising flour
120g caster sugar
2tsp baking powder
1 egg
120ml milk
75g melted butter
1tsp cinnamon
1/2tsp nutmeg/mixed spice

#### **METHOD:**

Mix all the dry ingredients together.

Beat the egg and milk together and add to the dry ingredients, with the butter.

Spoon into twelve muffin cases and, optionally, top with a little cinnamon sugar.

Bake at 200C/400F/Gas Mark 6 for 20 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Sprinkle with more cinnamon sugar to finish.
