



Hello everyone!



Cosy Mac 'N' Cheese

I know very little about Thanksgiving, being a Brit, but from what I've read online, mac 'n' cheese is a staple. So I'm offering you my tried and tested recipe. Here I used red Leicester and cheddar, but most hard cheeses work. Top with a little extra cheese before baking if you want. This recipe serves



INGREDIENTS:

300g pasta 4 slices parma ham/cooked bacon 125g spinach 30g butter 2tbsp plain flour 400ml milk 250g grated cheese

METHOD:

Prepare all your ingredients before starting to cook. Pour boiling water into a saucepan and add the pasta. Melt the butter in another saucepan, then once bubbling, add the flour. Whisk for a minute until cooked, then gradually add the milk, whisking constantly. Turn the heat up and whisk until the sauce starts to bubble and thicken.

Once this happens, add the grated cheese and whisk while it melts.

Drain the pasta and add to the sauce alongside the spinach and parma ham/bacon.

Pour into a dish and bake for 20 minutes at 180C/Gas 4.
